Acts of Kindness Scholarship - \$500

Students will be nominated by members of the faculty or their peers for acts of kindness done in their daily lives. Nominations will be reviewed by a committee of Step Up to Excellence mentors, students/friends of Sara McNeill, and the McNeill Family. Finalists will then be required to write an essay about why a person should do kind and generous acts. Essays will be reviewed by the same committee and a winner will be selected.

Adele Caron Scholarship - \$1,000

This scholarship will be offered to a female student of Lithuanian or Russian descent, who would be interested in pursuing a field in women's apparel or design.

Amvets Auxiliary Charles H. Lane Post #1977 Scholarship - \$200

This scholarship is to be awarded to a female graduate who shows patriotism, a desire to do her best, and caring for others.

Scott Andrews Memorial Scholarship - \$500

To a graduating senior, who has been in attendance at Stoughton High School for a minimum of two full years and is in need of financial assistance to continue in music education beyond high school.

Jessica A. Bartell Memorial Scholarship - \$100

To a graduating senior who is accepted in an accredited program in Oceanography, Marine Biology, Science, or Veterinary Medicine.

William A. Batte, Sr. Memorial Scholarship - \$200

This scholarship is to be awarded to a student-athlete who has attended Stoughton High School for four years and has been accepted to any two or four year college or university. Preference to those in need of financial aid.

Linda A. Bodanza Memorial Scholarship - \$300

To a graduating senior who is going on toward a degree in Family and Consumer Sciences or childhood development. Consideration should be given to someone who has a strong sense of family commitment and a positive outlook on life. Other fields of endeavor may be considered.

Charles Breen Memorial Scholarship Given by the Knights of Columbus, San-Salvador Council (3) - \$500

This scholarship is available to any graduating senior going on to further education.

Ruth Place Brown Memorial Scholarship - \$100

To a graduating senior who has participated in one of the performing music groups throughout his/her career. Preference will be given to any person who displays the following characteristics: strong character, cooperation, spirit, and dedication to the music program.

Caritas Good Samaritan Medical Center Scholarship - \$500

The scholarship will be awarded to a deserving student entering the Nursing field or Allied Health profession.

Cedar Hill Golf Course Memorial Scholarship - \$1,260

To be awarded to a senior male or female who plans to attend a four year college. Preference will be given to those that have participated in sports at the high school.

Century 21 Access Properties Scholarship - \$500

To be awarded to a senior graduating in good standing and in need of financial aid in order to further his/her education at a four year college or university.

E. LeRoy and Betty F. Clark Memorial Scholarship - \$400

This scholarship is to be awarded to a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High School a minimum of two years, who has shown excellence in the disciplines of both English and mathematics, and who will attend a four year institution of higher learning. The recipient will be selected jointly by the Directors of the English and Mathematics Departments on the basis of academic achievement and merit.

Clube Luis De Camoes Scholarship - various

To students who are the son/daughter of a club member, of at least two years, with a GPA of 3.00 or better, ranked in the top 50% of the class and are active in school/community activities. The students must attend a two or four year institution after graduation. A three-paragraph essay is required answering one of three questions as listed on the scholarship application.

Frederick Conley Memorial Scholarship given by Charles H. Lane Amvets Post #1977 - \$300

To a senior of scholastic promise who plans to continue his/her education beyond high school and who has been accepted by an accredited institution of higher learning. The recipient of this scholarship must have been a member of the Stoughton High School Marching Band or Color Guard.

The Julie M. Conroy Memorial Scholarship - \$200

To be awarded to a student who has been serviced under Chapter 766 for a minimum of one year, who will further his/her education after graduation. In the event that there is no student who meets this qualification, the scholarship will be awarded to a student who plans to enter the field of special education. If none of the above criteria can be met, then it will be presented to a student who plans to enter the field of general education.

Kevin Coombes Memorial Scholarships (2) - \$500

A. To a graduating senior who is a member of the Stoughton High School Ice Hockey Team, giving preference to a student who attended South Elementary School.

B. To a graduating senior who has graduated from the South Elementary School, who is planning to attend a two-year college or who has received services under Chapter 766.

Diana Beth Cooper Memorial Scholarship (2) - \$300

To students who intends to further his/her education at a school of higher learning. Scholarships will be awarded to students who best exemplify the following characteristics: love, honesty, compassion, and friendship.

Francis T. "Mike" Crimmins Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000

To an outstanding graduating senior who exemplifies leadership qualities, strong moral character, and integrity. The deserving student must have attended Stoughton High School for a minimum of three years, have shown academic achievement and have been active in extra-curricular activities and community service in the Town of Stoughton. The scholarship is to be used for tuition, fees or texts at a four year accredited institution of higher learning.

Daniel F. Davis Scholarship - \$250

To a graduating senior who demonstrates leadership qualities outside the traditional school setting.

Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School Outstanding Citizen Scholarship - In Memory of Bertha E. Landman - \$300

To a graduating senior who has been accepted at an institution of high learning and who, while a grade 5 student at the Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School, was selected by the Dawe School Grade 5 faculty for Outstanding Citizen Award as part of the annual Grade 5 Class Night Program and activities.

Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School Outstanding Citizen Scholarship - In Memory of Irene Steinberg - \$100

To a graduating senior who has been accepted at an institution of high learning and who, while a grade 5 student at the Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School, was selected by the Dawe School Grade 5 faculty for Outstanding Citizen Award as part of the annual Grade 5 Class Night Program and activities.

Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School P.T.O. Outstanding Citizen Scholarship - In Memory of Charles C. Tucker - \$300

To a graduating senior who has been accepted at an institution of high learning and who, while a grade 5 student at the Joseph R. Dawe, Jr. Elementary School, was selected by the Dawe School Grade 5 faculty for Outstanding Citizen Award as part of the annual Grade 5 Class Night Program and activities.

Joseph and Anna DeVito Memorial Scholarship - \$350

To a student who will pursue a business career. He/she must attend either a business school or a college majoring in business. The student must have attended Stoughton High School for four years.

John L. Donnelly, Jr. Memorial Scholarship - \$250

To a senior who has exhibited excellence in the classroom and who has participated in athletics at the varsity level. This scholarship is to be used for tuition purposes to a four year program. This award should not be available to a student receiving other scholarships.

Arthur L. Donovan Scholarship - \$200

To a senior of outstanding character and citizenship who shows a spirit of civic-mindedness. The award will be used for tuition purposes.

Kenneth C. Fine Memorial Scholarship - \$250

To an outstanding student with good moral character and integrity who exhibits an interest in pursuing a career in the medical sciences. If there is no such student, then any deserving student.

James H. Fowler Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000

To be awarded to graduating seniors who will be attending college and majoring in a public service career (Education, Criminal Justice, Nursing, Political Science) with preference to students not the recipient of any other scholarships. Special thanks to W.W. Grainger, Inc. for matching funds.

Friends of Stoughton Hockey Paul Rodriguez Scholarships (6) - \$500

To be awarded to a Senior who has played varsity Ice Hockey at Stoughton High School and wishes to continue his or her education at either a college, trade school, military service or other higher educational institution. For monies to be distributed after scholarship selection, student must provide the school with either a tuition bill or receipts totaling scholarship amount for education related expenses: ie: laptop computer, books or other educational materials.

Criteria to be chosen for scholarship:

1. Must have played ice hockey for Stoughton High School for at least two years
2. Graduate having completed their senior year playing ice hockey for Stoughton High School
3. Has assisted and promoted the Friends of Stoughton Hockey organization

Irene Gay Memorial Scholarship - \$300**Donated by Patients at New England Sinai**

This scholarship is to be awarded to a graduating senior who has maintained a "B" average for the last two years while enrolled in college preparatory courses. The applicant should be accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning with the intent of pursuing a career in medicine, therapy, or a related health field. He/she should be active in school and community activities and have the recommendation of a teacher, counselor, health care professional, or clergyman.

Gibbons School P.T.A. Scholarship - \$500

To a graduating senior of scholastic promise who attended the Gibbons School for a minimum of three years. The recipient must have been accepted at an institution of higher learning and be encouraged to continue education by virtue of the financial assistance rendered by this award.

Jen Gitto Scholarship - \$300

This scholarship is offered to a graduating senior who has demonstrated significant community service in helping children or the elderly, a person who has been a positive influence on the graduating class, and a person who has been accepted into a four year accredited college program. Preference will be given to a person who will continue to provide care and service to the young or elderly in their career choice.

Goddard Health Foundation (2) - \$1,000

This scholarship is awarded to students who are planning to continue their education in the health care field. It is available to students who are enrolled in a public high school and are

residents of one of the following towns or city: Stoughton, Easton, West Bridgewater, East Bridgewater, Bridgewater, Brockton. Each student must be enrolled or have been accepted into a two-year four-year degree or certificate program. Each winner must be a person of good character, demonstrate a need, and also have a well-balanced interest in studies and extracurricular activities.

Paul M. Goulston Memorial Scholarship - \$500

To a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High School for at least two years and who has indicated an interest in the field of medicine, nursing, or pharmacology. The student should have been active in school or community activities and not the recipient of another scholarship of equal or greater value.

Jordan B. Hadgi Memorial Scholarship - \$250

The Jordan B. Hadgi Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has participated in and illustrated involvement in our community, has participated in the Stoughton Youth Commission programs, has demonstrated sensitivity and concern for others, and who has attended Stoughton High School for four years.

Helen Hansen P.T.O. Scholarship - \$300

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior going on to further education who attended the Helen Hansen Elementary School a minimum of three full years, including all of Grade 5. The recipient should be ranked among the top 75 students in his/her class and should have demonstrated good citizenship and academic excellence. He/she should have participated in extracurricular activities.

Thomas J. & Dorothy Herron, Jr. Memorial Scholarship - \$300

The recipient of this scholarship shall be a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High a minimum of two years and who plans on attending an institution of higher education. Preferably, the student will have actively participated in high school sports at the varsity level.

The Honey Dew Donuts Scholarship - \$250

To be awarded to a senior who will attend an accredited four year college or university, and/or maintains a B- average or better, and/or participates in local community/charitable activities, and/or demonstrates financial need, and/or meets the general requirements as determined by the scholarship committee.

E. A. Jones P.T.A. Scholarship - \$1,000

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who is a former Edwin A. Jones School student.

Dr. Eric Kramer Scholarship - \$250

To be awarded to a deserving student who will be studying science at the college level.

Richard C. Lennon Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000

To a senior interested in furthering his education at an institution of higher learning. Preference will be given to a member of the varsity baseball team who plans to continue playing baseball in college.

Jeffrey Eric Levitz Memorial Scholarship - \$300

The recipient of this scholarship shall be a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High School for at least two years and has been accepted to the school of music or art at an accredited institution of higher learning.

Martha L. MacNevin Scholarship - \$1,000

To a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High School for four years, has been accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning, has shown outstanding school spirit, and who will be encouraged to continue his or her education by virtue of the financial assistance rendered by this scholarship.

Tracy R. Madan Memorial Scholarship - \$250

To a senior interested in wrestling (not necessarily a team member) who wishes to further his education.

McGowan Family Scholarship - \$500

In Memory of Karen McGowan

This scholarship is to be given to a Stoughton High School graduate who will be attending the University of Massachusetts in Amherst with an interest in liberal arts/communications or in environmental studies. The graduate should be an outdoor enthusiast sensitive to preserving the quality of our environment.

Sara McNeill Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000

This scholarship is offered to a student who has overcome adversity, either in learning or in personal life. The student should demonstrate perseverance and resiliency. Applicants should be planning on pursuing further education though they need not attend a four year college. Students should submit a 1-2 typed page essay explaining the challenges they have met. Two faculty members or staff from SHS should sign the essay in support of the student's application.

Dr. Robert G. O'Donnell Memorial Scholarship - \$200

To be awarded to a senior who demonstrates loyalty, concern for others, good moral character and integrity. The recipient must be accepted to a four year college and be a member of a single parent family. A 150-word essay entitled "How I Demonstrate Loyalty" is required from applicants.

Catherine Marie Olson Memorial Scholarship - \$200

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who participated in the Chapter I or other special needs program in the Stoughton schools. The recipient must have been accepted by an accredited institution of higher learning. Preference will be given to a student who attended the West Elementary School.

The Peter Everett Scholarship, in Memory of Donnie Coleman - \$300

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who graduated from the Gibbons School prior to June, 2006, must enroll in a Massachusetts Community College, (first preference will be given to Massasoit). All criteria being equal, the lowest ranking class member is to receive this scholarship. Verification of tuition payment required. This may be used in either

semester or the academic year following graduation. If not used within this time frame, the scholarship will be forfeited.

Rosemary E. and William R. Perdigao Memorial Scholarship - \$500

To a senior of scholastic promise who will be encouraged to continue his or her education beyond high school, preferably in the field of education.

Portuguese National Club of Stoughton Scholarship-various

To a deserving son or daughter of a fraternal member of "The Portuguese National Club", who has attended Stoughton High School or other high school (public or private), for at least three years, who ranks high in character and plans to further his/her education.

Leokadia and Antoni Rafalko Scholarship - \$300

To a graduating senior who has been accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning, must rank in the top 15% of the class, show leadership qualities, good moral character, strong values, and has displayed involvement in school and community activities. Preference will be given to applicants of Polish heritage.

Randolph Savings Bank Scholarship - \$1,000

To a deserving student for further education.

Shirley Reppucci Memorial Scholarship (2) - \$500

The Reppucci Memorial Scholarships, sponsored by the Parents of Performing Students Inc., are to be given to graduating seniors pursuing further education. These students must have been active within the Music Department and must have demonstrated exemplary service, dedication, and spirit to the music organization. The recipients will be chosen by the Music Department.

Minna S. Richmond Awards (2) - \$500

These scholarships are to be awarded to seniors who have achieved general excellence in accounting courses, plan to continue in higher education, and best exemplify those values of honesty, compassion, citizenship, and community service.

Rockland Trust Company Charitable Foundation Scholarship - \$500

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who is continuing his/her education at an accredited four year college in business, economics, finance, accounting, or another related field and who is ranked in the top 50% of the graduating class.

Anne Romansky Memorial Scholarship - \$500

This scholarship is to be awarded to a senior who has been accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning, shows a spirit of brotherhood and civic-mindedness, and needs financial aid in order to further his/her education.

Michael Romanuk V.F.W. Post No. 1645 Scholarships (5) - \$750

To seniors of scholastic promise who will be encouraged to continue education beyond high school by virtue of the financial assistance rendered by these awards. Preference will be given to the sons, daughters, and grandchildren of Post 1645 members.

Rotary Club of Stoughton Scholarships (2) - \$1,000

To outstanding seniors who have been in attendance at Stoughton High School for two full years and are in need of financial assistance to continue education beyond high school.

Paul David Sarnie Memorial Scholarship - \$300

To a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton Public Schools from elementary through senior high school, who excels in mathematics. Consideration going to someone pursuing a career in accounting. Student should display kindness, wit, generosity, and love for their family and fellow students.

Paul P. Sassone Memorial Scholarships (2) - \$1,000

To be awarded to a graduating boy and girl who will be pursuing a career in the arts (music, drawing, singing, art set and direction, special effects) and/or any type of creative writing for children. The recipients should also possess an outgoing personality, wonderful sense of humor, be loving, generous, caring, sensitive and able to "make anyone smile." Also, the recipient must put others first, love children, have a creative mind, and has been an active participant in the fine arts program.

Save Our Stoughton Scholarship - \$200

To be awarded to a graduating senior who has demonstrated outstanding community service in the Town of Stoughton. The recipient of this scholarship must have been in attendance at Stoughton High School for four years and must have been accepted by an accredited institution of higher learning.

Polly Savicki Memorial Scholarship - \$500

To a senior who has financial need and a desire for a career in education. Preference will be given to a senior who excels in mathematics and/or science.

Richard Chandler Sawyer Memorial Scholarship - \$250

To a graduating senior who will pursue further education in the field of print journalism. In memory of Richard Chandler Sawyer, who never applied for a scholarship, this scholarship recipient shall be chosen by the English Department and not by the usual application process.

Shalit Family Mathematics Scholarship - \$500

For excellence in mathematics as determined by scores in the Annual Olympiad sponsored by the Actuaries' Club. The student must have attended Stoughton High School for four years and the scholarship must be used toward tuition, fees, or texts at an accredited institution of higher learning leading to a baccalaureate degree.

Richard Smith Memorial Scholarship - \$150

To a graduating senior of scholastic promise who has been enrolled at Stoughton High School for at least four years and is continuing education beyond high school. Preference will be given to a student entering the field of environmental studies.

Sons of Italy, Stoughton - \$500

In Memory of our beloved brothers and sisters

To a deserving student of Italian descent who has attended Stoughton High for at least three years, who ranks high in character, and who plans to further his/her education. Preference will be given to the son or daughter of a lodge member.

Detective John P. Sousa Memorial Scholarship - \$300

Given by the Blue Knights, Inc., Massachusetts Chapter 1. To a graduating senior who is going on toward a degree in Law Enforcement or Criminal Justice. In the event that no graduating senior qualifies for the scholarship, it can be given to a graduate of Stoughton High School who is currently earning a degree in Law Enforcement or Criminal Justice.

South School P.T.O. Scholarship - \$200

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has been accepted into a two or four year program of continuing education. The recipient should be ranked in the top 100 of his/her class and have attended the South Elementary School for a minimum of three years.

South Shore Savings Bank Citizenship Award - \$500

This scholarship will be given to a Stoughton resident who has displayed personal qualities of sincerity, demonstrated commitment and concern for community; and does not necessarily excel academically but made the school a better place because they were part of it.

Nora and Elmer Southworth History Scholarship - \$500

The recipient will be the most proficient graduating student in History by vote of the teachers of history at Stoughton High School. He/she must be going on to higher education.

Stoughton Art Association- \$500

To an outstanding senior at Stoughton High School who has participated in the art program for at least two years, preferably the last two, and who during that time has shown exceptional artistic ability and intends to continue his or her education in art beyond Stoughton High School. Recipient is restricted to the study of visual art and must be either a Stoughton High School student or a graduate of another high school who has a relative at Stoughton High School.

Stoughton Association for Exceptional Citizens Scholarship (2)- \$300

To graduating students going on to further education. Scholarship to be presented to one or more sons or daughters of S.A.E.C. members. In the event that there is no student who meets this qualification, the scholarship should go to one with a mental or physical handicap. If not possible, it may be awarded to a student being served under Chapter 766. If none of the above criteria can be met, then it may be presented to a student who plans to enter the field of special education.

Stoughton Boosters Club Scholarships (2) - \$250

These scholarships are to be awarded to two senior student athletes, one (1) girl and one (1) boy, in good standing, with a solid academic record, whose parent/guardian is a member of the Stoughton Boosters Club and who plan to continue their education beyond high school. The recipients of these awards may use the funds at any accredited institution of higher learning.

Stoughton Chamber of Commerce Scholarships (2) - \$1,000

To be awarded to students who have shown maturity and responsibility in their interactions with the business community.

In Honor of James Callanan - \$500

To be awarded to a deserving Stoughton High School music student.

Academic Achievement Award - \$300

This award is to be given to an outstanding member of the senior class who is planning to further his/her education but is not currently enrolled in college preparatory courses. This award is sponsored by the National Honor Society.

The Victor C. Melendy Foundation Scholarship – (Up to 4) - \$1,000

This scholarship will be given to a senior who exemplifies courage, compassion, humor, strength, unselfishness and must show a willingness to help others. He/she must participate in extra-curricular activities, have attended Stoughton High School for 4 years, and must be attending a 4 year college or university in the fall.

Kirk Mooney Business Scholarship (2) - \$500

To be awarded to students who are furthering their education in the field of Business. Recipients will be selected by the Business Department.

Elissa P. Selig Memorial Scholarship - \$500

To be awarded to a college bound student studying journalism or communication.

Stoughton High School Music Scholarships (2) - \$300

To outstanding seniors who have participated in the Music Program of Stoughton High School for at least three years, preferably the last three, and who plan to continue their education beyond high school. The recipients of these awards are not restricted to the study of music and may use the funds at any accredited institution of higher learning.

Stoughton High School Parent Teacher Student Organization E. Selig Memorial Exceed Scholarship - \$500

To a deserving student of SHS for further education.

Stoughton High School Student Council Scholarships - Various Amounts

To be presented to seniors who have shown outstanding participation in a variety of extra-curricular activities and who have shown potential for academic success at an accredited institution of higher learning. Preference will be given to members of Student Council.

Stoughton Historical Society

John E. Flynn Memorial Award - \$250

To a student who shows decided interest in local history. Will be judged on an American Studies essay submitted.

Stoughton Irish-American Society Scholarship - \$500

This scholarship in the amount of \$500, is to be awarded to a senior who is of Irish decent who has been accepted at an institution of higher learning. Consideration will be given to students who have a strong commitment to family, demonstrated community service, and academic achievement.

Stoughton Lions Club Scholarship (2) - \$1,000

In Memory of All Deceased Members of the Stoughton Lions Club

To outstanding seniors who have been in attendance at Stoughton High for a minimum of two years and are in need of financial assistance to continue education beyond high school.

To a student who has attended Stoughton High School for three years; is of high character, deportment, scholarship, and dependability, as evidenced by punctuality, truthfulness, loyalty, and self-control.

Board of Directors Scholarships

Candidates for the scholarship must have participated in at least one STOYAC activity and will be going on to post high school education. Candidates must also have volunteered their services and time to ensure the continued success of the STOYAC organization and its programs, i.e.: refereeing, coaching,

umpiring, scoring, etc. Candidates must include a detailed resume listing each of the STROYAC activities that the applicant has completed and the contributions made to be considered for this scholarship.

Stoughton Youth Soccer Scholarship (2) - \$500

To students that have played within the Stoughton Youth Soccer League, and have volunteered their time and effort (refereeing, coaching, etc.) to insure the continued success of the Stoughton Youth Soccer League program. Up to two scholarships may be awarded per year. The graduating student must be a resident of Stoughton, but need not be attending Stoughton High School. Candidates must include a detailed resume listing their involvement with Stoughton Youth Soccer League. Candidates must be attending an accredited two or four year college.

Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) Scholarship - \$200

To be awarded to a deserving senior who has displayed outstanding effort toward promoting the cause of preventing drunk driving and increasing student and community awareness of this issue. Consideration to be given, but not limited, to leadership, citizenship, SADD membership and academic achievement. Scholarships to be applied toward a graduate program of study.

Trushin Memorial Scholarships

A. Stacy Miriam Trushin Memorial Scholarship - \$600

To a graduating senior who has attended Stoughton High School for three out of four years and has been accepted to an accredited four year school of higher learning, and who plans to pursue a career in the sciences with medical school/medical research as a future career goal. Student should display the following characteristics: compassion, cooperation, sensitivity, love for fellow students, zest for life and eagerness, willingness and a "thirst" to learn.

B. Suzanne Carole Trushin Memorial Scholarship - \$300

To a graduating senior who will be entering an accredited four year institution of higher learning and who has attended Stoughton High School for three out of four years. The recipient should best exemplify the characteristics of love and dedication, and display a sensitivity and a positive spirit toward family and fellow students.

The Jack F. Wallace, Jr. Memorial Scholarship (2) - \$500

The award will be granted to both a male and female student who graduate with the intent to attend a four year college to major in accounting or business. These scholarships should go to students who have not received any other scholarship and maintained a "B" or better average in their senior year in Math.

Cynthia A. Walsh Scholarship - \$500

The basic criterion for eligibility is to be one of need. The recipient of this award must have been enrolled at Stoughton High School for at least two years and be accepted by an accredited institution of higher learning.

C. W. Welch Memorial Fish and Game Preserve, Inc. Scholarship - \$500

This scholarship is to be awarded to a student pursuing further education in the fields of forestry, botany, or environmental engineering.

Richard L. Wilkins Scholarship Fund - \$500

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who attended the West Elementary School for a minimum of three full years, and who will be going on to further his or her education.

Honey Zizzo Scholarship - \$1,000

To be awarded to a male or female student that has been accepted into a LPN or RN program. The student's cumulative grade average must be a B+ or better. A written essay will be required with the scholarship application. The essay topic will be: "Why Do You Want to be a Nurse". There is a minimum of two pages required.
