Halloween Reminders and Tips



- *A parent or responsible adult should always accompany young children on their neighborhood rounds.
- *By using a flashlight, they can see and be seen by others.
- *Stay in a group, walk slowly and communicate where you are going.
- *Only trick-or-treat in well known neighborhoods at homes that have a porch light on.
- *Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk.
- *If no sidewalk is available, walk at the farthest edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- *Never cut across yards or use alleys.
- *Never enter a stranger's home or car for a treat.
- *Obey all traffic and pedestrian regulations.
- *Always walk. Never run across a street.
- *Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks.
- *Remove any mask or item that will limit eyesight before crossing a street, driveway or alley.
- *Don't assume the right of way. Motorists may have trouble seeing Trick-or-Treaters. Just because one car stops, doesn't mean others will.
- *Never consume unwrapped food items or open beverages that may be offered.
- *No treats are to be eaten until they are thoroughly checked by an Adult at home.
